Spring 1997 North American Migration Count in North Carolina

The Spring North American Migration Count (NAMC) for 1997 was conducted on 10 May and included reports from North Carolina for the fourth year. Reports from previous years may be found in earlier issues of *The Chat*. The spring NAMC is conducted annually throughout North America north of Mexico. Unlike traditional Christmas and spring counts that may be done during a two- or three-week period, the NAMC is conducted on a single day to obtain an annual continent-wide approximation of where the neotropical migrants are on the second Saturday in May. This is done by organizing volunteers in each state and province to count birds in an entire county or province, rather than in a smaller count circle. The NAMC was begun in 1992 by Jim Stasz, a birder in Maryland who is attempting to determine the pattern of migration in North America. North Carolina has participated since 1994.

Although a good number of migratory species were seen in the 1997 NAMC, the standardized annual date can be as much as two weeks after many migrants have passed through some parts of North Carolina. However, the purpose of the count is not to determine how many migrants are in a state or province at the peak of migration but rather to identify the density and distribution of bird species throughout the whole continent north of Mexico at a given point in time. Therefore, some species are likely to be gone from some southern states and will not have arrived yet in other states and provinces further north.

Participating Counties

Eighteen counties reported spring migration counts in 1997, the same number as in 1996. There were several new counties this year, however, and some which were counted last year that did not send a report. Counties in this count not reported in 1996 include Alamance, Macon, and Polk (reported in 1995 but not 1996). Counties represented in 1996 for which no reports were received in 1997 include Durham, Onslow, and Orange. Alleghany, Craven and Wilkes also have reported in previous years but not in 1997. The following is the list of counties (and county seats) for which reports were received for the

1997 North American Migration Count in North Carolina, by geographic region:

Mountain: Avery (Newland), Buncombe (Asheville), Cherokee (Murphy), part of Cleveland (Shelby), Henderson (Hendersonville), Macon (Franklin), and Transylvania (Brevard).

Piedmont: Alamance (Graham), Chatham (Pittsboro), part of Cleveland (Shelby), Forsyth (Winston-Salem), Guilford (Greensboro), and Randolph (Asheboro).

Coastal Plain: Cumberland (Fayetteville), Jones (Trenton), Moore (Carthage), Pitt (Greenville), and Polk (Columbus).

Coast: Brunswick (Southport).

The number of counties reporting in the four years of this state's participation in the NAMC has been far short of the potential (North Carolina has 100 countie). The density and distribution of bird species during spring migration in North Carolina and the continent will be better known with the inclusion of more counties in each of the state's regions in the future. Readers who are interested in such data are encouraged to contact the author to receive assistance in starting a spring migration count in their counties.

Summary Data

The NAMC uses the following definitions for the four reporting categories: "regular" - observers move from one place to another within a relatively large part of a whole county during the period from dawn to dusk; "night" (formerly "owling") - observers tally all species (not just owls) seen or heard from midnight until dawn and from dusk to midnight; "stationary" - observers spend a significant amount of time from dawn until dusk at one observation point and count birds that move past; and "feeder watching" - observers spend a minimum of one hour at one location counting birds that are attracted to a feeding station or stations, making an attempt to count the birds only once.

242 participants from 18 counties reported 36,890 individual birds (individuals by count categories: 35,838 regular, 18 night, 307 stationary, 727 feeder) of 225 species for the 1997 NAMC in North Carolina.

Parties/Observers: Regular parties included 212 observers in 100 parties. Night (Owling) parties included 27 observers in 13 parties. Stationary parties included 10 observers in 5 parties. Feeder Watching included 37 feeder observers watching 55 feeding stations. Hours: Party hours for all categories

totaled 750.29. Regular party hours totaled 624:14 and included 348:01 by foot, 255:43 by car, 9:00 by boat, 4:00 by bicycle, 3:30 by ATV, and 4:00 by golf cart. Night (Owling) hours totaled 13:45. Stationary hours totaled 16:30. Feeder Watching hours totaled 96:00. Miles: Party miles for all categories totaled 2530.45. Regular party miles totaled 2685.7, including 250.5 by foot, 2150.45 by car, 5 by boat, 3.5 by bicycle, 4 by ATV, and 5 by golf cart. Night (Owling) miles totaled 112.5

Rarities, Species of Note, and High Counts

Many of the county coordinators reported species that are uncommon in their counties, unusually late or early, present in remarkable numbers, or of special interest to birders in the Carolinas. Most of the coordinators contributed good details on the more unusual sightings.

In most of North Carolina the weather was more like March than early May on count day. Low temperatures ranged from well below freezing in the higher mountains (29° on Grandfather Mountain) to the 40's and low 50's in the eastern part of the state. Highs didn't get out of the 30's in the high mountains but did get into the lower 60's in the Piedmont and further east. A substantial number of counties reported high winds most of the day, with wind speeds topping out in the 20's and gusts above 30 mph in some locations. Compared to last year, fewer species were seen that are often associated with winter despite the wintry spring weather. An interesting feature of the 1997 count, however, is the seemingly larger number of spring migrants that overlapped with species normally seen in winter. Good numbers of duck species were still around in many of the counties. Most counties reported a good count of swallows, with four counties turning in a "grand slam" of all six swallow species. Warblers were recorded in good numbers this year, both in species and as individuals.

Alamance County produced 2 Ruby-crowned Kinglets that were a little late in leaving. In the high mountains the Avery County count again recorded several species that would be considered "winter" birds in most of the state, including 3 Red-breasted Nuthatches (one at a hummingbird feeder!), 2 Winter Wrens, and 9 Pine Siskins.


Brunswick County reported several interesting species: a pair of Horned Grebes in breeding plumage in a tidal creek at mid-tide on Ocean Isle Beach; Blue-winged Teal, American Wigeon, and Bufflehead hung around for the count; 5 Red-breasted Mergansers (compared to 16 last year), one female in a tidal creek at Ocean Isle Beach, three on a sandbar at Sunset Beach inlet, and one in the ocean, all females or first spring males; 2 American Coots, one on

a cypress pond off Rt. 904 and the other on Lake Metcalf at Sea Island Plantation (a coot has lingered here as late as June for the past three years); and a Piping Plover was located at the west end of Sunset Beach.

Buncombe County birders reported two lingering duck species, a Ring-necked Duck and 2 Lesser Scaup, as well as both species of kinglets. Birders in Chatham County recorded 2 American Black Ducks, 1 Common Merganser, and 2 Red-breasted Mergansers, and was one of the counties that turned in a "grand slam" of all six swallow species. Chatham was the only county reporting Mississippi Kite and Bachman's Sparrow this year: 2 Bachman's were heard singing near Merry Oaks where a breeding colony was discovered several years ago. Cherokee County had 1 Gray-cheeked Thrush on the count. In Cleveland County 3 Dickcissels were heard in the general area where a pair were seen mating during the count week. Cumberland County had three species of lingering ducks, 7 American Black Ducks, 2 Canvasbacks, and a Ruddy Duck; 2 American Coots; an interesting sighting of the state's only reported Blac. Tern, an individual that was "doing its dance" over a pond near the confluence of Rockfish Creek and the Cape Fear River; and an excellent sighting of a well-described late Vesper Sparrow located on the site of the old Becker Sound diggings near where the tern was seen.

Counters in **Guilford County** spotted two duck species that were late in leaving, 4 Blue-winged Teal and 1 Ruddy Duck; 3 Bald Eagles (2 adults and 1 immature individual) continued the successful nesting at Lake Higgins for at least the fourth year; a Ruffed Grouse was uncommon for the county; a lingering American Coot was seen; and 2 Gray-cheeked Thrushes were reported.

Henderson County observers noted a Northern Harrier, one of only two reported in the state; an American Coot was "left over from the huge numbers that spend the winter"; and Henderson was one of the few counties reporting all six swallow species. Jackson Park yielded three interesting species, 2 Willow Flycatchers, which breed in the county; 1 Least Flycatcher, which was calling; and a Philadelphia Vireo (no details provided). A Swamp Sparrow and 2 Rusty Blackbirds also lingered. Jones County reported the only Least Bittern on the count; observers noted a Swallowtail Kite that was seen during count week but it wasn't located on count day; and 1 White-throated Sparrow was unusually late for the county. Macon County count was conducted by the newly formed Highlands Plateau chapter of the Audubon Society for the first time in 1997. Although they did not have the official instructions and checklist (and so did not record numbers of individuals), they did turn in records of the only Peregrine Falcon, Fox Sparrow, and Purple Finch reported in the state.



Moore County reported 2 Mute Swans, part of the feral population that has bred at Wood Lake for several years. Also of interest were 3 thoroughly described Red-breasted Mergansers on Lake Pinehurst; a thoroughly described Merlin (the only one reported in the state); a lingering American Coot; and the only Red-cockaded Woodpecker reported in the state. Pitt County birders reported 53 Cattle Egrets, the only ones recorded in the state; a remarkable count of 120 Wood Ducks; 3 adult Bald Eagles; 2 White-rumped Sandpipers at the Greenville Sewage Treatment Plant; 1 Stilt Sandpiper (no details); 1 Gray-cheeked Thrush seen along Little Contentnea Creek; and 4 Henslow's Sparrows, the only ones on the count, at the Voice of America site where they breed.

Polk County turned in one of the several counts of all six species of swallows; 1 Gray-cheeked Thrush was reported; and the count yielded the only Cerulean Warbler and the only Savannah Sparrow on the state-wide count. Randolph County had a lingering American Coot and reported a Loggerhead Shrike, a species of concern in the central part of the state.

Transylvania County reported one of only two Northern Harriers in the state-wide count; a Sora that was seen from 22 April through 13 May was seen on count day; a Black-capped Chickadee, always an interesting species in North Carolina and the only one reported, was heard adjacent to the entry road to Black Balsam at almost 6000' elevation; a Red-headed Woodpecker, rare for the county, visited a feeder in Brevard for four days and was still there on count day; the state's only Brown Creeper was noted; 2 Winter Wrens (seen

every year) were heard at 5500'; a well-described Philadelphia Vireo was located along a private lane just north of Solomon Jones Rd.; and a White-crowned Sparrow, which had been frequenting a feeder in Brevard, was still present on count day.
