The Spring 1999 North American Migration Count was conducted on 8 May 1999. 185 observers in 16 counties divided into 98 parties in South Carolina found 40,732 individuals in 229 species on this relatively mild and pleasant day. Of this total, 30 species were "exclusives," found only in one county. The exclusives break down as follows:
